# C.A.S.H. project at a glance

- Project duration 36 months (10.9.2009-9.9.2012)
- Total budget 3.4 MEUR which comes from:
  - European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) 69%
  - Norwegian government 6%
  - project partners 25%
- 12 partners in 7 countries
- Lead partner Turku School of Economics, Finland
- Project approved in the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of calls for projects under the Baltic Sea Region Programme 2007-2013.







# Baltic Sea Region Programme 2007-2013

- Programme area covers approximately
   2.4 million km² almost half of EU area
- Area population of 110 million amounts to 23% of EU
- Aggregated GDP is about 16% of the EU
- Program partners in 11 countries
- Total funding available 236.6 MEUR



## Scientific Advisory Board


- Scientific & research Partners of C.A.S.H.; meets 3-4 times per year
