VIRTUAL TOUR ACROSS THE BALTIC SEA REGION

The OIL SPILL project strengthens the oil spill response capability in coastal and shallow water areas in the Baltic Sea Region.

Together, 13 Project Partners aim to benchmark the best oil spill response practices, clarify key legal issues, build up training schemes, and organize relevant training events.

In spring 2020, we traveled virtually across the Baltic Sea Region and visited each Project Partner in Finland, Sweden, Denmark, Lithuania, Latvia, and Estonia as they introduced themselves.

M/S HAVERI TABLETOP EXERCISE FOR VOLUNTEERS IN NAANTALI (FI), MARCH 2020

Together with other Voluntary Rescue Service organizations, the Finnish Red Cross organized an oil spill response exercise "M/S Haveri" for volunteers in a leading position. It was a tabletop exercise held in Naantali, Finland, on 8 March 2020.

The volunteers discussed and went through their roles during an oil spill incident the facilitators had planned. This oneday event covered four days of oil spill response activities.

OIL SPILL Partners from the Lithuanian Red Cross Society, Danish Civil Protection League, Finnish Environment Institute, and the University of Turku observed the fictional chain of events as well as how this kind of training is organized in Finland.



PLANNING INCIDENT MANAGEMENT AND COMMUNICATION EVENT

Danish Civil Protection League and Southwest Finland Emergency Services will organize a joint OIL SPILL Incident Management and Communication seminar in 2021. All Project Partners were invited to an online meeting on 20 May 2020 to discuss and plan the event further.

The 2-day event will be held in Copenhagen, Denmark, in March 2021. It will include presentations and workshops focusing on best practices and lessons learned from previous oil spill accidents. The idea is in capacity-building and to come up with recommendations for the future.

MAPPING OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

To map the current oil spill response operational procedures country-wise, the Ministry of Environment of Estonia collected questionnaire responses and started to prepare a comparative overview based on them. The questionnaire concerned, i.e., legislation and other regulatory issues, response coordination, and the involvement of non-governmental organizations.

The draft was introduced and discussed in an online workshop on 2 June 2020. Each OIL SPILL Project Partner was represented in the meeting.

OIL SPILL SIMULATOR EXERCISE IN TALLINN, ESTONIA, MAY 2020



On 21 May 2020, **Tallinn University of Technology** organized a small-scale simulator exercise in oil spill response. It was based on the scenario created for the Balex Delta 2020 but shortened and modified to meet the simulator capacity.

Representatives from the Police and Border Guard and the Estonian Maritime Administration were invited to participate in the simulation. The training was considered useful and a very important addition to live field-exercises.
